

After review of the information received from the institutions as well as the principal investigator involved, the awards and were suspended for approximately 30 days to allow the institution time to correct all deficiencies in their animal care and use protocol. As of an all deficiencies have been corrected and the college is now in compliance with NSF as well as NIH Guidelines. Further, there is not sufficient evidence to substantiate any criminal wrongdoing under the USC 18 § 1001 (false certifications) or loss to the government under USC 31§ 3729. Therefore, I recommend transferring this case to an A-case.
