follow-up interview with Mr. was conducted telephonically. Mr. stated that there had been friction <u>betwe</u>en Dr. and himself from the beginning. Mr. Claimed enac er. had given him bad evaluations to help remove him from the project. Mr. stated that all of the workshops had occurred. He did state, however, that was paid a stipend of \$5,000 but never attended any except a one week workshop. Mr. was unaware of any other misuse of funds and just wanted to make sure that NSF was aware that Dr. was paying his wife with grant funds.

As we found no evidence to substantiate a misuse of funds and there are no regulations prohibiting family members from working on the same grant, further investigation of this matter is not warranted at this time.
