Subject: Resolution of Allegations

Dr. [REDACTED] alleged that Dr. [REDACTED] while supervising Dr. [REDACTED] NSF grant, required Dr. [REDACTED] to budget approximately \$2,800 for "abstract fees" or "analytical costs," even though no "analysis" was done. In addition, Dr. [REDACTED] alleged that Dr. [REDACTED] was purchasing [REDACTED] materials from [REDACTED] which he then used to create [REDACTED]. According to Dr. [REDACTED] in this work, Dr. [REDACTED] then sold the [REDACTED] back to [REDACTED] for a profit.

Dr. [REDACTED] had just been fired, and had been removed from his [REDACTED] offices. Dr. [REDACTED] was involved in a dispute with [REDACTED] and Dr. [REDACTED] about the circumstances of his dismissal, and about the ownership of various items taken from Dr. [REDACTED]'s office. Dr. [REDACTED] claimed that Dr. [REDACTED] was a disgruntled former employee who was fired for threatening to sabotage Dr. [REDACTED]'s research, and who was trying to get Dr. [REDACTED] in trouble by complaining to us.

We examined Dr. [REDACTED] NSF grants as well as those of Dr. [REDACTED] and examined account summaries and payroll details for these grants. Dr. [REDACTED] Dr. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were interviewed. In addition, I reviewed the grants and their documentation with an OIG scientist.

We did not identify any charges for abstract fees or analytical costs (or anything analogous to them) in Dr. [REDACTED]'s NSF grant. In addition, we did not identify any transactions with [REDACTED] for Dr. [REDACTED] or Dr. [REDACTED] NSF grants. [REDACTED] accounting personnel examined the account records for the grants as well, and confirmed that there were no analytical costs to Dr. [REDACTED]'s NSF grant, and that there had been no transactions of any kind with [REDACTED] in the NSF grants.

Based on the lack of evidence in support of Dr. [REDACTED]'s allegations, this case is closed.
